HOW DOES IT WORK?

Library Juice Academy offers short courses for library professional development using an online course management system. We use Moodle, an easy-to-use open source platform with few technical requirements beyond an internet connection and standard browser interface. Courses are taught asynchronously (meaning that you don't have to be online at any particular time) and involve reading assignments, offline activities, and class participation. A four week course involves about fifteen hours of work. Our instructors are knowledgeable professionals and academics actively engaged in the learning process, and are there to support you.

DO YOU GIVE DISCOUNTS?

We give discounts on purchases of bundles of registrations. Five registrations come at a 10% discount; 15 at a 15% discount, and 25 registrations or more come at a 20% discount. Additionally, there is a ten percent discount when enrolling in the full set of courses in a certificate program.

WHO ARE YOUR INSTRUCTORS?

Most of our instructors are librarians at academic and research institutions, and some are library and information science faculty. They teach for us because they have developed significant specialized knowledge in an area of practical application in our field. Some are innovators, some scholars, and some are simply technical experts with teaching abilities. CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS AND SERIES

We offer five certificate programs that build a significant level of expertise in areas that many librarians find relevant.

CERTIFICATE IN USER EXPERIENCE FOR LIBRARIES

Topics covered include the key concepts of UX design and how to employ them in your website projects, concepts in design thinking, the ins and outs of information architecture, writing for the web, concepts in universal design and accessibility, usability testing and other research methods, service design, and how to create a website content strategy.

CERTIFICATE IN LIBRARY MANAGEMENT

This six-course series provides a strong foundation in managerial skills, and is intended for new managers or those who would like to enhance their current knowledge base. Though these courses touch on organizational theory, the primary focus is on practical skills that can be readily adapted to individual needs.

CERTIFICATE IN LIBRARY INSTRUCTION

This certificate program is designed to provide a strong grounding in professional practice as an instruction librarian in an academic library setting.

CERTIFICATE IN XML AND RDF-BASED SYSTEMS

In this 6-course certificate program, you will gain competency as a coder in XML and RDF-based systems that create, transform, manage, and disseminate content and metadata. Topics covered include XML fundamentals, XPath, DTDs and Schemas, standard markup languages, XSLT and Xquery, the semantic web, RDFa and RDFa Lite, RSS, ontologies and linked data, and the SPARQL semantic query language and protocol.

CERTIFICATE IN EARLY CHILDHOOD LITERACY

Whether you work directly with children in the library or want to learn more about early literacy to help you better serve your community, this certificate program offers key information on child development and early literacy and activities to put it into practice in your own situations and environments.
